Everyone is invited to the Pa Fly Fishing Museums **Open House on Sunday November 2nd starting at 11:00 am.** We will be unveiling the new Pa Bamboo and Wood Rod Makers Display. The display will have thirty-six bamboo and wood rods dating almost as far back as the Civil war, to the present time. This display will also have several rods built by Vincent C. Marinaro from Mechanicsburg, PA.

We also will be **unveiling our fishing vest display.** All of the vests were **manufactured in PA**, including vests made by the former C.H. Masland Company in Carlisle, PA. The vests range in age from the 1940's to the 1970's. Thanks to Ken Okorn for his help with this display.

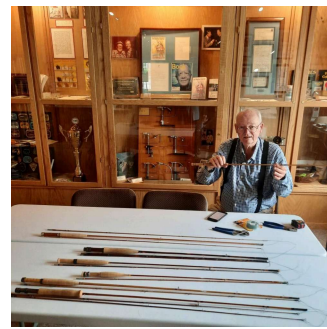
